Dress Code

We believe that the appearance of pupils reflects the school as a whole. Some attire is not appropriate in a school environment.

Our guidelines are as follows:

Jewellery

Jewellery is kept to a minimum with only studs in ears for reasons of safety. Necklaces, bracelets and dangly earrings pose a safety hazard when children are running around and playing on equipment. If you wish your child to continue to wear a particular piece of jewellery due to sentimental reasons, please let us know. Jewellery of value should be left at home to ensure it is kept safe.

Body Piercing

There is no body piercing (other than ears).

Make up

No make up is necessary (nail polish is makeup).

Clothing

Clothing needs to be appropriate for children to participate in all activities comfortably at school. We want our children to participate in a physically active environment so clothing and footwear worn to school need to be appropriate for this. It also needs to be sun smart so clothing that exposes shoulders, chest, stomachs or backs should not be worn to school.

There may be times when specific clothing is required for example: for running, gymnastics, other physical education programmes and swimming. The children will be required to wear the correct clothing.

No illegal or anti-social slogans will be visible on pupils clothing i.e. drug usage, swearing, gang patches.

A good guide for clothing is that others should not be able to see up it, through it or down it!

Hair

We ask that hair is kept tidy and clean. At the Tech Centre Year 7/8s need to have long hair tied back. Hair needs to be tied up for swimming.
