FROM THE PRINCIPAL.....

Nau mai haere mai,

Reunification Drill - March 5th

We will be carrying out a **Full Reunification drill** on Wednesday, March 5th. This will be a whole school exercise to prepare our community for the reality of an emergency situation and make sure we are prepared.

The aim of a Reunification Drill is to make sure that your child(ren) can be cared for by people you have authorised to do so in the case of an emergency where the school has to close. The practise ensures that our systems work well, that adults know what is expected of them and that the children know what is going to happen. It also ensures that we have the correct emergency contact information for every child.

What is going to happen:

- •At approximately 2.25 pm there will be a 'mock evacuation'. All children will assemble at the assembly point inside the basketball courts, this is our secondary assembly point. You will be able to collect your children from 2:45pm onwards. Authorised adults who are collecting children should be aware of the following procedures:
- •When you come to school you will have to sign out your child/ren with the staff member at the entrance to the basketball courts.
- •A staff member will then collect your child/ren and deliver them to you.
- •Please move off the school grounds quickly, unfortunately this is not the time to linger and chat.

No child will be released on this day until they have been signed out by one of the authorised adults listed on our Student Management System.

What you need to do:

- •Make sure your child knows who can pick them up if their direct caregivers are not around, and make sure they match our records too.



From the Board of Trustees

Did you know? Our strategic plan is Paekākāriki school's key strategic document.

Our strategic plan reflects the board's key focus areas, what we want to achieve, how we will achieve it and how we will measure success (how we will know if we have achieved our objectives). Each board meeting, the board monitors progress against plan objectives.

Last year, our plan had three key focus areas: literacy, te ao Māori, and hauora (holistic well-being).

This year, the board has updated our first focus area of literacy to literacy and numeracy to reflect the government's rollout of a new maths curriculum. Our other focus areas of te ao Māori and hauora remain unchanged.

From the Potty Potters Garden Nursery

For those of you new to the school, Potty Potters is a group of volunteers who grow plants in the nursery at the back of the school to sell in our May and Labour weekend plant sales. Money raised is used to fund the school's gardening programme for Tamariki on Wednesdays, as well as the winter soup programme.

We are busy filling our nursery in readiness for the sale on Saturday 10 May, the day before Mother's day. We join in with the PTA who have a fundraising event at the same time.

The Potty Potters meet on Fridays between 9.30 am and 1pm, and we welcome new volunteers, ongoing or casual, as well as donations of plants. It's a very friendly group, ranging in age from 17 to 75+. Only a few have family connections with the school, and some come from outside Paekākāriki. We're big believers in "it takes a village ...".

This year a new group is starting on Monday afternoons 3-4 pm, led by Maree White and others. No gardening experience required, kids welcome. Meet by the school pool. Thanks, Maree, for initiating this.




Year 7 Vision Screening - Information for parents

To support your child's travel on Metlink services, please note the following important point.

• High school students are required to present their secondary school photo ID when requested by onboard staff if not in uniform. For eligibility information please check the concessions section here.

Below is a summary of the conditions of carriage. The full version can be found here:

- Children from age 5 and intermediate school students are entitled to the Child Concession while in or out of school uniform.
- Secondary school students must either be wearing their school uniform, or present a valid physical or digital secondary school photo ID.
- A Snapper enabled Student Photo ID can be used as a Snapper card to access the Child Concession.
- Children 16 or older who have left school do not qualify for a Child Concession.
- Tag on and off for each part of the journey. If you do not tag off, a default fare applies, see more information here.


