- **Encourage independence** – Let kids take responsibility for age-appropriate tasks and solve problems on their own.
- **Embrace boredom** – It's the gateway to creativity. Avoid offering screens as a quick fix.
- **Connect emotionally** – Be present, playful, and a calm guide as they learn to navigate emotions and relationships.

Neuroscience

At our recent Teacher Only Day, staff heard from Kathryn Berkett. Kathryn has a Master's in Educational Psychology and certification in the Neurosequential Model of Therapeutics. Since 2009, she has been simplifying complex neuroscience for global audiences, earning praise for making tricky concepts accessible. She offers practical, real-world applications. Staff from 7 schools and 2 kindergartens were fortunate to listen to Kathryn for an hour as she covered various topics applicable to education today.

One of the standout messages for me was about screen use for children. We all know how damaging screen time is for children's brains and bodies, and Kathryn continued to make this point. A helpful rule she shared with us was;

"No small screens for under 7 year olds AND no small screens for those in the presence of under 7 year olds".

CURRICULUM

Curriculum

Here's some helpful information about the new curriculum.

We are taking a **structured and measured approach** to implementing these curriculum changes. We prioritise student wellbeing and learning continuity while ensuring our teaching practices align with the new framework. Our staff are receiving appropriate professional development, and we will keep you informed throughout the transition process.

What's Changing?

New Zealand's curriculum is being refreshed with a new name: **Te Mātaiaho**. The biggest change for parents to understand is that the traditional "Curriculum Levels 1-8" are being replaced with "Phases of Learning" that better align with your child's school years.

Old System: Curriculum Levels

Level 1: Years 1-3 (mostly)

Level 2: Years 3-5 (mostly)

Level 3: Years 5-7 (mostly)

Level 4: Years 7-9 (mostly)

Levels 5-8: Years 9-13

Levels were confusing because they didn't match school years clearly

New System: Learning Phases

Phase 1:
Years 0-3 (New Entrants to Year 3)

Phase 2:
Years 4-6 (Intermediate)

Phase 3:
Years 7-10 (Junior Secondary)

Phase 4:
Years 11-13 (Senior Secondary/NCEA)

Phases clearly match your child's school years!

When Are These Changes Happening?

2025 **Term 1:** English (Years 0-6) and Maths (Years 0-8) start using the new curriculum

2026 **Term 1:** English (Years 7-13) and remaining Maths years begin

2027+ Other subjects (Science, Technology, etc.) will be updated progressively

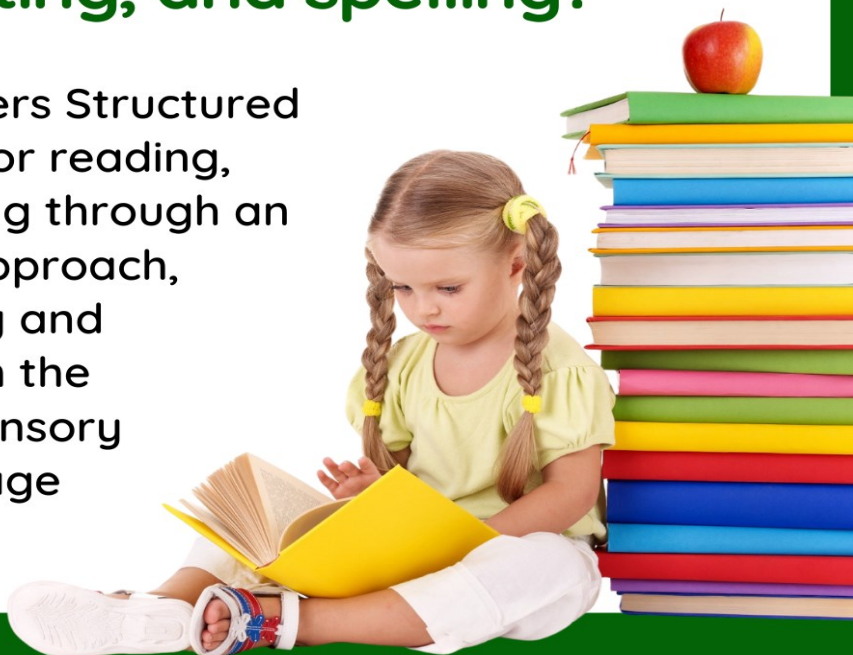
