



Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) -Our Barefoot Learner Focus

"E koekoe te tūī, e ketekete te kākā, e kūkū te kererū" - "The tūī chatters, the kākā cackles and the kererū coos" A beautiful metaphor for diverse thinking and perspectives — perfect for discovery and encouraging tamariki to ask questions in their own way.

A Paekākāriki Barefoot learner can ask questions to discover new things. They can try to figure things out and explain their thinking to others.

WHATS HAPPENING AT PAEKĀKĀRIKI SCHOOL

During Discovery Day, staff are in the environment, closely and carefully observing tamariki. This valuable information is used to help guide curriculum planning for the coming term - what students are interested in, what questions they have, and areas of struggle all help us shape a curriculum targeted to our students' needs and interests.







Teina Update

Kia ora whānau, and welcome back to Term 3!

Following on from our rich learning last term, this term we're diving into the concept of "What is above us?" — a

theme that will spark curiosity, wonder, and exploration across the school.

In Te Kohanga (TK), we'll be exploring Flight — asking big questions like "How do planes stay in the sky?" and investigating the science and mechanics behind flying machines.

In Ngā Kākano (NK), our learners will be looking up and wondering "What's above us in the sky?" as they explore rockets, space travel, and where those rockets actually go!

We're looking forward to another exciting term of hands-on learning, discovery, and creative thinking.
